In 1989 hundreds of area citizens worked with DNR staff to draft the Winnebago Comprehensive Management Plan. Twenty years later, much of the plan has been implemented. This conference is aimed at involving citizens again as we look toward planning for the next 20 years.

What Topics will be Covered at the Conference?

DNR staff Art Techlow and Ron Bruch will present accomplishments of the existing plan and explain what has yet to be done, while other experts will focus on lake issues outside the domain of the DNR. Expect wide-ranging discussions about our four lakes. Topics will include water quality, wildlife habitat, the fishery, recreational boating,

aquatic invasive species, aquatic vegetation, water levels, shoreland development, property values, economic impacts, rules and regulations, scenic impacts, noise/nuisance complaints, channel concerns, tourism and other issues.

Conference participants are encouraged to talk about their concerns and future hopes for the lakes.
